The world's largest buyer of goods and services is the **Federal Government**, with purchases totaling more than **\$425 billion** per year. The government especially encourages small businesses to bid on contracts for some of these needs. To that end, these Federal agencies are required to establish contracting goals, with at least 23 percent of all government buying targeted to small firms.

The management of eFUEL EFN, Corp. believes that the company will have the opportunity to significantly increase revenues with the approval of an 8(a) registration.

Earlier this year, [I-NEX Worldwide](#) entered into a Federal registration and approval for I-NEX to become a preferred provider with Super 8(a) exemption status for Federal non-bid contracts relating to background checks, verifications of government employee applicants, as well as, drug-testing and testing kits. **eFUEL EFN, Corp. is a 49% owner of I-NEX Worldwide.**

Earning Super 8(a) status from the [Small Business Administration/General Services Administration](#) (GSA) is very significant to I-NEX, as it will advantageously position the company with respect to receiving GSA contracts. The GSA serves as direct contractor for all vendor services provided to the Department of Homeland Security, the Veterans Administration, the Department of Defense, the Department of Energy, as well as, all other U.S. Federal Government agencies.

GSA sales in 2007 for pre-employment background checks came to over \$177 Million; while drug testing services were in excess of \$693 Million. **These are exactly the business that I-NEX is in...**

The GSA is widely known as the largest purchaser of products and service in the world. eFUEL/I-NEX Worldwide expects it will soon be positioned as the only Super 8(a) provider of employee background verification service to the GSA. The GSA designates up to 23% of its massive multi-billion dollar budget specifically for small businesses, with minority-owned businesses receiving preference, and Super 8(a) exempt businesses having the highest priority

The United States government may directly outsource non-inherently governmental services (or functions) to Super 8(a) enterprises without study or cost comparison. A Super 8(a) exempt status is extremely beneficial to any company, as businesses exempt under this classification receive contracts without having to engage in bidding processes that favor vendors who submit the lowest cost bids. This exemption program allows socially disadvantaged businesses (SDB) to receive contracts that only the largest companies coming in at the lowest price would receive otherwise.
